Friends and Family Feedback:

If we have your current mobile number, you will receive a text message two hours after your appointment asking your views on the quality of your appointment. This is part of our NHS contract regarding the services we offer. Alternatively, there are forms in the waiting room and reception for you to complete.

Online Registration:

If you have access to the internet at home, please register for on-line access, where you can book appointments and repeat prescriptions online.

Influenza vaccines:

If you are in one of the "at risk groups" and you have not already received your annual influenza vaccine, please make an appointment as soon as possible.

Shingles Vaccinations:

1.9.2017-1.4.2018

Patients become eligible for the shingles vaccine on their 70th birthday. Patients born after 1.9.1942 remain eligible. Patients born before 2.9.1942 become eligible on their 78th birthday. Patients remain eligible for the shingles vaccine up until their 80th birthday.

Car-parking:

The Practice often receives comments with regards to the lack of car-parking next to the surgery. The Practice rents the Church car-park for the provision of patient car-parking. The Practice also rents the Village Hall car-park which is situated approximately 50 meters from the Dispensary end of the Surgery. The staff all park in the Village Hall car-park to allow patients full use of the Church car-park.

It is very obvious that the Church car park cannot be enlarged. As the Practice is situated in a beautiful central village location there are many other minor roads available for parking.

Did not attend appointments

Please would you help the Practice by cancelling appointments with the Practice or Hospital if they are no longer required? This will enable the appointment to be reallocated to another patient. If you would like to receive text reminders please register at reception for this service.

Between the 1st May 2016 and 30th April 2017 an astounding <u>1617</u> GP and Nurse appointments occurred where patients did not attend their appointments. This equates to 345 hours of Clinicians time at a substantial cost to the NHS.

Unpaid Carers are people who care for a family member, a friend or another person in need of assistance or support with daily living. They include those caring for the frail aged, people living with long-term medical conditions, people with a mental illness, people with a disability and those receiving palliative care.

Anyone can become a Carer. Carers come from all walks of life, all cultures and can be any age.

A young carer is someone aged 18 or under who helps look after a relative who has a condition, such as a disability, illness, mental health condition, or a drug or alcohol problem.
